Terry Wayne Taylor

1947-2009

Terry was a partner of one of Australia's leading firms, Ferrier Hodgson. His involvement in the profession included acting as President of the IPA (Insolvency Practitioners Association of Australia), now ARITA, sitting on national and state committees of the IPA for many years and sitting on the board of INSOL International and its Executive Committee. Terry was honored as a life member of the IPA. For many years, Terry was the editor of the published Australian Insolvency Management Practice CCH, which became the bible of insolvency practice in Australia. He was also a regular speaker at conference within Australia and around the world.

Terry was a dear friend and colleague. It is difficult to express in few words, the qualities and character of this humble and immensely talented individual. I met Terry at INSOL International where he and I served together on the Board. Terry had a great ability to listen to other people's views and opinions. Sensing my hesitation as a new incumbent on the Board, he constantly encouraged me to speak my mind and share my views, in Board meetings and outside, guiding me along the way. He was a wonderful teacher and educator. He would disarm people with his sense of fair play and treatment of all people as equals. Terry as an educator had no peers.

He was a humble and immensely talented individual who sought no accolades other than a laugh and friendship from people that he would meet. His thirst for information meant that he spoke to everyone and was always interested in others and never spoke about himself. Due to his good nature and drive, Terry did more than any other professional in the field of insolvency.

To Terry, holidays, weekends and any free time were all some type of adventure, such as cycling in Vietnam, exploring the lanes of Old Delhi, playing golf in Ireland, rowing down streams, surfing, bush walking and even riding a bike between Vienna and Prague to get to an INSOL conference.

His wife Monica, also a dear friend of my wife Asha and I, livened up many social functions with her spirit for fun and conversation. Monica and Terry came as a team, be it in work, fun or play. Asha and I cherish the memories of time spent with Terry and Monica.

Terry was a great friend of India. We had long conversations about India. He was fascinated by her history and geography, people and culture, festivals and beliefs, diversity and unity. He whole-heartedly backed proposals for INSOL International to engage with the Indian market, often being the most vocal supporter of India in the room. In a way, he was one of the invisible forces that steered my selection as the Vice President of INSOL International, paving way for the appointment of the first Asian and youngest President of INSOL International.

It has been a pleasure and honor to have had Terry as a mate and mentor.
